

WHY HAVE I RECEIVED THIS BILL?

The overall aim of your BID is to improve and enhance the area for the benefit of the business and local community. Our aspiration is for Redcliffe and Temple to be known not only as a thriving, vibrant commercial district but also as an outstanding and caring community.

All eligible business rate payers within the BID boundary are required to pay a levy of 1.5% of their rateable value so that the work can continue to fund the improvements outlined in the business plan. This bill is for the period 1st November 2023 to 31st October 2024.

OUR PRIORITY AREAS ARE ARRANGED INTO 5 THEMES:









KEY BID ACTIVITY IN 2022/23

On behalf of the BID community we have been able to deliver many exciting projects over the last year including our partnership with Bristol Light Festival in February which attracted over 250,000 visitors. We also extended our popular winter tree lights to Temple Gardens, installed outdoor summer furniture and games in Temple Quay and we have continued to invest in social action projects with Grassroot Communities and Babbasa.

The hard work of your dedicated BID cleansing team has continued to delight businesses with 1,680 graffiti items removed, targeted jet washing and over 4,000 van miles covered over the year.

This year we have introduced over 200 free online live training courses for all BID businesses and have partnered with Place Support Partnership to identify savings of over £130,000 on business operating costs.

Our BID sustainability commitment has evolved through our collaboration with Bristol Green Capital Partnership offering tailored support to businesses with their climate action plans. We have continued a programme of lunchtime events including yoga and our new run club in partnership with Left Handed Giant and we have now maintained over 700 bikes through our increasingly popular Dr Bike service.
